5.1 GDPR

From Matt Jones

As discussed amongst the committee, I agree the membership data we keep is appropriate and justified. Disclosure of names and addresses to the printing company (to enable them to post the magazines on our behalf) is also appropriate and necessary. We should check that Parchments destroy the files after use. Expiry and removal of accounts is automated by the website and I although I'm not sure of the timescales, it seems to be less than a year as I occasionally have to investigate members expiring when they forget to renew.

Conclusion: informed consent - keep pressing forward

There are 3 mechanisms to hold data:

- Explicit consent
- Contract - ex. Membership
- Legal compliance

Consider recording of IP addresses and setting of cookies

accu_membership@accu.org to be the GDPR contact

There is a 72 deadline to report if passwords have been extracted.

How do we know if we've been breached?

There are a number of inspectable properties, like ssh connection failure events and bytemark monitors traffic levels. The website uses md5 hashed passwords, whereas mailman exposes them in the clear

Action: email blast to all members with privacy policy

Query about employing GDPR auditor services? Not for now.

Breaches are reported at <http://haveibeenpwned.com>, and this allows registration to be notified if a dump appears on the web

Action: Look into ads.accu.org for any implications
